100,000-Watt Power Asked

"Our current filing is an amendment to that of KOMO's orginal application for Channel two." Willard W. Warren, KOMO general manager, said. "In answer to our inquiry the F. C. C. indicated Channel four was their substitute for Channel two for commercial purposes in Scattle.

"We have applied for the maximum 100,000-watt power allowed

on Channel four nearly six times that of existing local TV facili-ties." Warren said, "and plan an antenna 1,000 feet above mean sea Jevel. Station KOMO has proposed an investment of more than \$1,000,000 in equipment and facilities and has a substantial por-

tion of the equipment on hand.
