## **Broadcast Schedules Altered**

Two stations altered their broadcast schedules in the past week. KOMO, as expected, increased its operation to 24 hours a day, 6 days a week. A new segment, called Nighttime Seattle, features the same soft, listenable transic as in the daytime hours, plus repeats of daytime features such as recreation reports, stock-market news and weather.

Host for the show, from 11 p. m. to midnight until 5 a. m. is Rocky Shay, who has done vacation and weekend work for KOMO, KSND and Yakima radio stations.

KRAB cut back its broadcast schedule to what is apparently six hours a day. The station is now scheduled to be on the air from 6 p. m. to midnight. Some exceptions exist (for the time being at least) such as the late-night talk shows on Tuesday and Wednesday. (See Page 15.)
